The Navigator is designed to help you commence your training and to provide an insight into how the system works.

The Navigator provides you with clear, complete and timely information on the curriculum, modules, courses and certificate requirements, nature of interaction with tutors and administrators, prerequisites, equipment requirements.

#### 1. eLP Educational Web-portal

**eLP Educational** web-portal provides free access to the modules, their printed versions, presentations, links to references, clinical cases, tests, questionnaires, materials for practical work, etc.

To start your training you have to register and to fill in your "profile". Once your profile is submitted the learning progress could be followed up and assessed. Then from the module menu you have to choose a module of his interest and to enrol the module.

Enrolment of the module allows having a free immediate access to it from the main page and creating your individual interface of eLP. Enrolment of the module provides an access to tutor, chats and forum with peers and tutors.

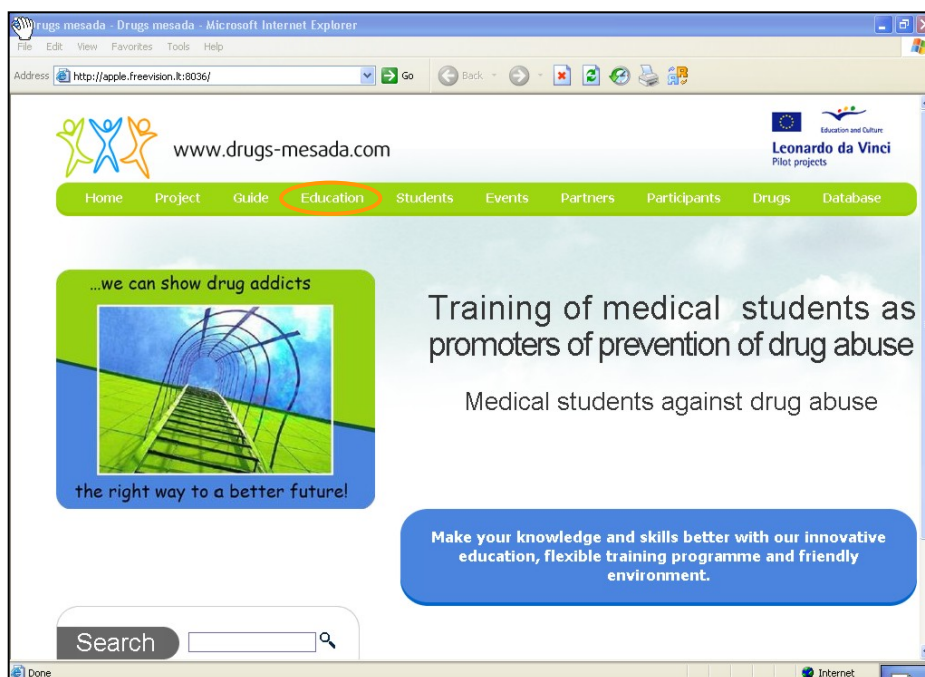

Before you can do anything in the e-LP you have to create your individual account by registering for the system. You also can use guest access, but it is very limited.

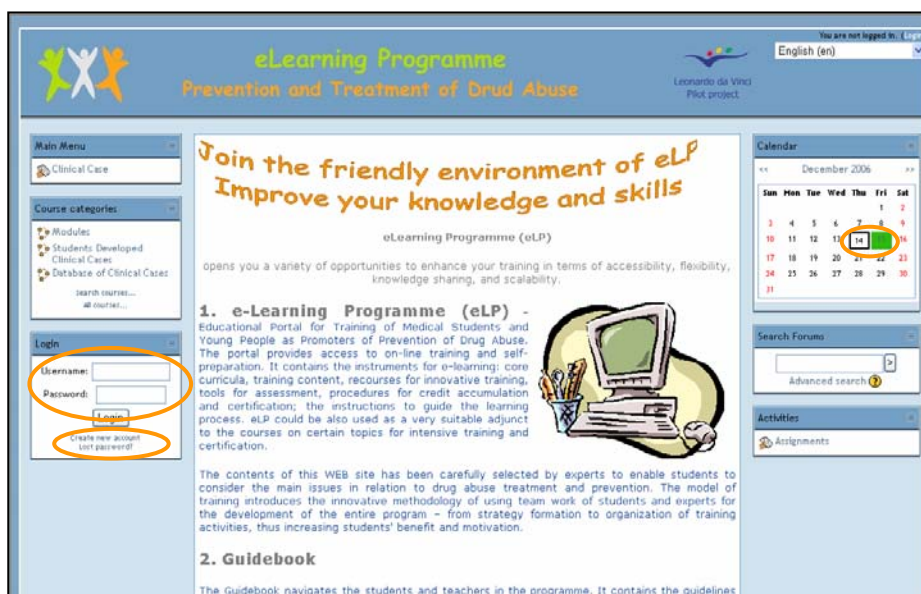
Here are the steps to create a new account on this web site:

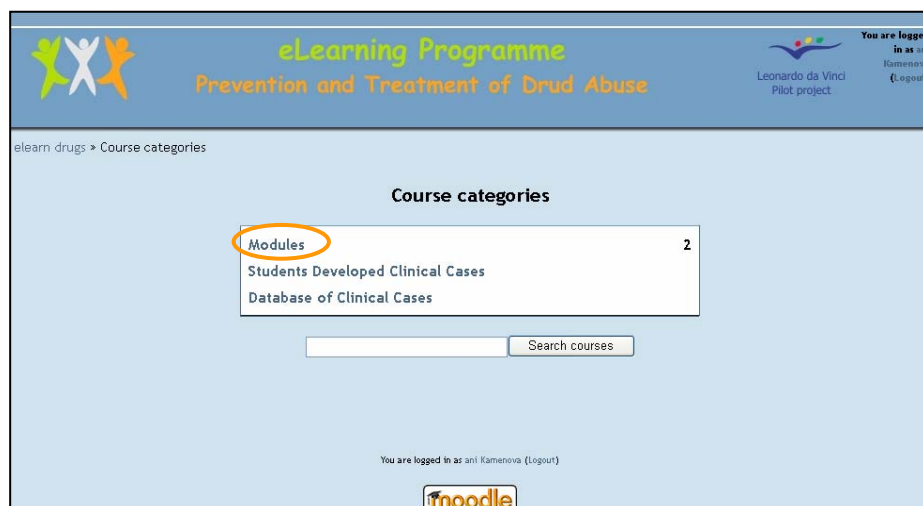
4.1 You will see this page after clicking on the link provided in your email. Your account is confirmed and you are logged in

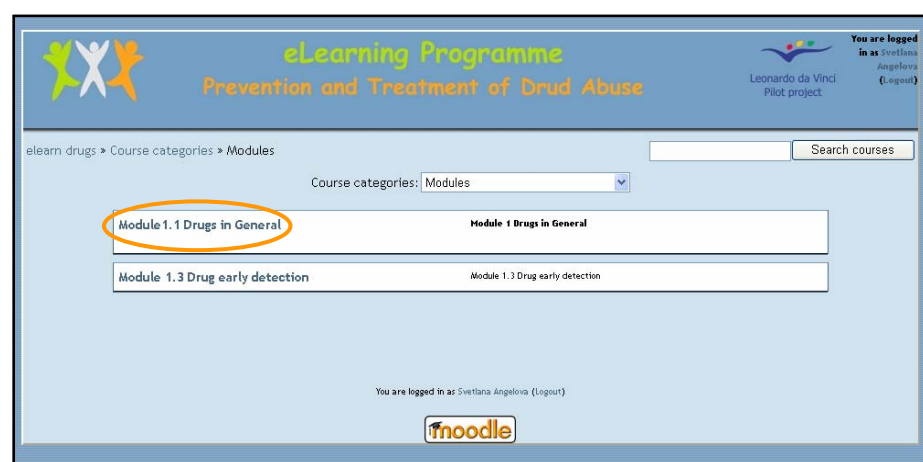
4.2 Now, to enter the educational content Click on **Courses**

4.3 To start your session you can choose from: **Modules**, **Cases** or **Courses**

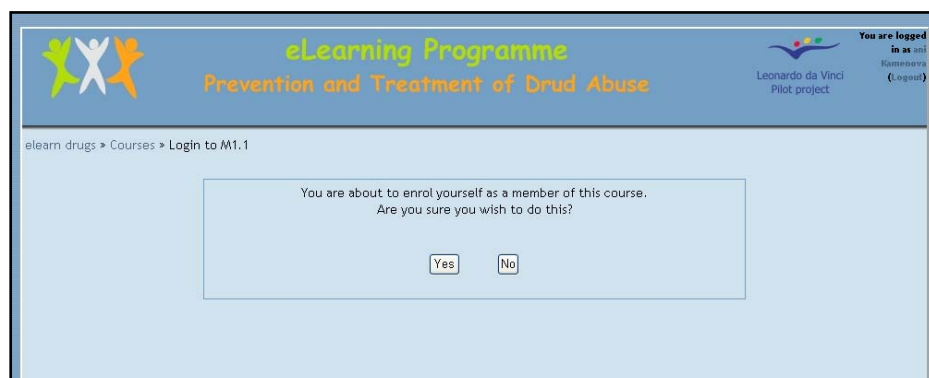
If you click on **Modules**, you will go to the module catalogue in the page Course Categories.

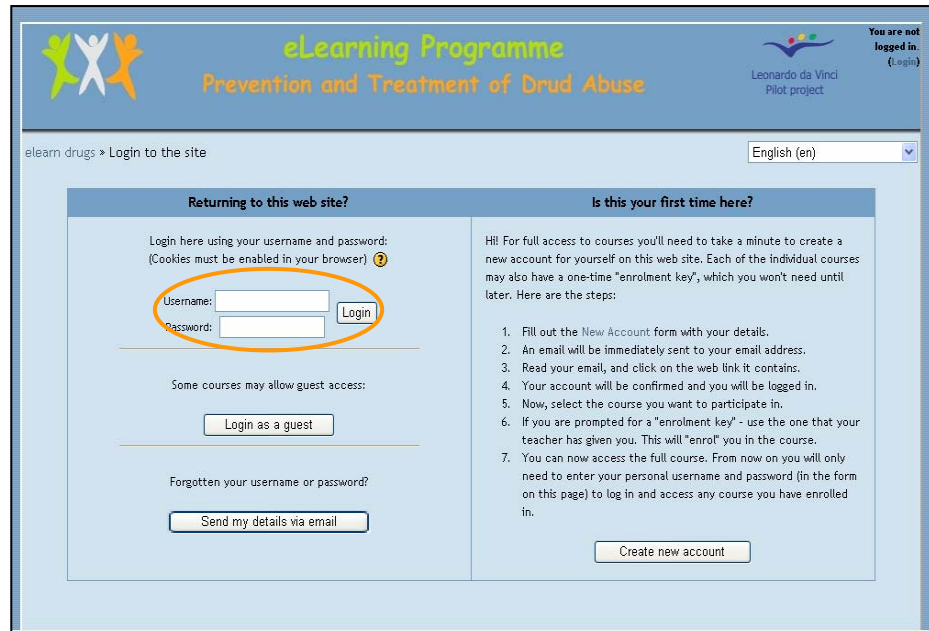
## 5. Profile Editing

Prior to starting the Module you will need to update your profile. It will form the basis for the developing your personalized portfolio – profile. Your profile enables the programme to follow up your learning process, and evaluate your progress.

5.1 To go to your individual profile, write your password and click on **Login**



5.2 To fill in your profile details. Click on **Edit profile**

so that you can learn exactly what you want to, it is strongly recommended to fill in all the details of your profile.

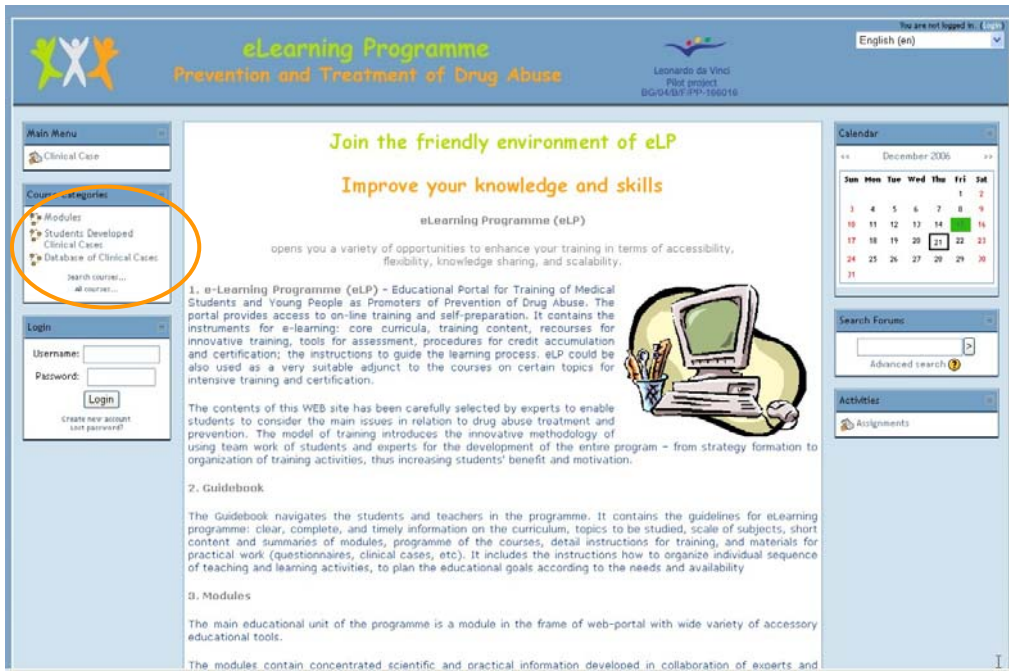

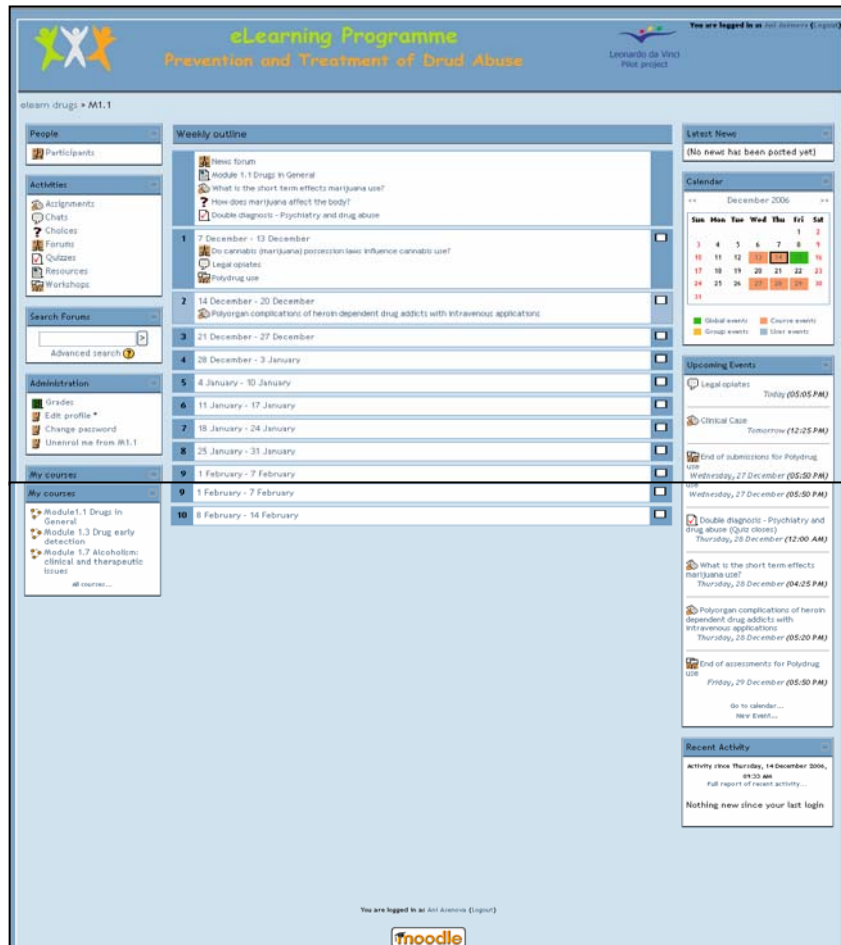
5.6 Select the **enrolled module** from the listed Courses under the Main Menu on the home page

6. Journal

Journaling is a popular educational tool to encourage students' self-reflection in the learning process.

The tutor opens an individual Journal for you, where you can present your individual reflections e.g. clinical case, or to get your opinion on certain problem. The Journal can be seen by you and your tutor only. After logging into the system on your page you can see the activity assigned for you individually. After you fill in your Journal with clinical case, it could be

assessed by an expert or tutor. Only the experts and tutors have the ability to assign a grade (there is no peer review). You are allowed to make a new version after corrections made by the tutor.

Journal activities provide you with extra credits.

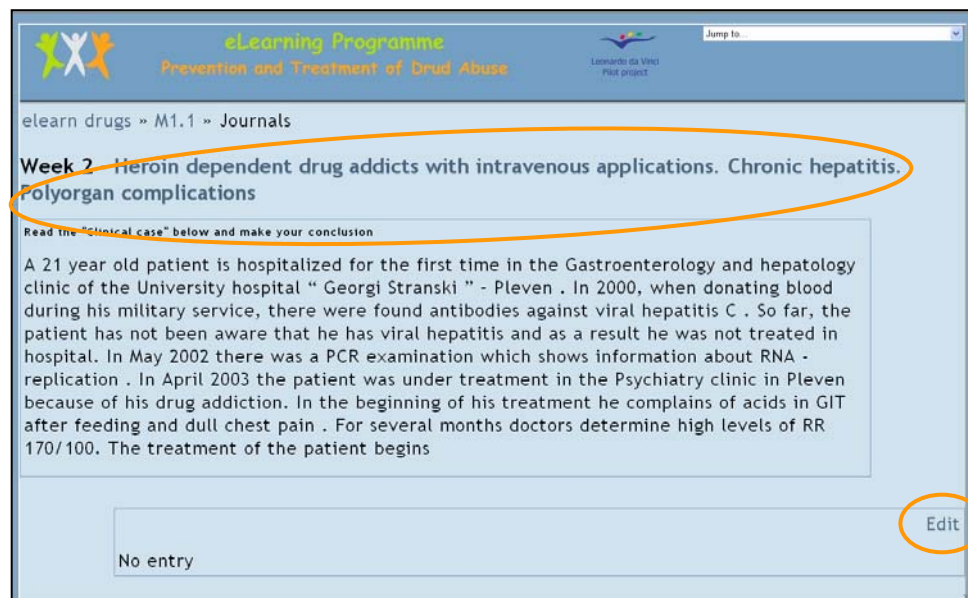
6.1 Click on the **Journals** button in the **Activities**
