## THE CONCEPT OF CONFIDENTIALITY. INFORMED CONSENT IN MEDICINE.

## **MODELS OF DOCTOR-PATIENT RELATIONSHIPS. RIGHTS OF PATIENTS.**

#### **Objective of the seminar 2:**

To enable students to understand both the concept of confidentiality and the essence of the informed consent and the differences between the basic models of doctor-patient relationships and to have a knowledge of patient's rights.

#### **Enabling objectives:**

At the end of the seminar the students should be able to:

- 1. Describe the concept of confidentiality and define the level of breach of confidentiality in concrete case vignettes.
- 2. Clarify the ethical necessity of the informed consent.
- 3. Recognize the criteria for the informed consent to be valid.
- 4. Comment the extent of the information disclosed by doctor.
- 5. Understand the essence of the implicit consent.
- 6. Explain the distinctions between different models of doctor-patient relationships.
