SEMINAR 6

ETHICAL PROBLEMS OF RESEARCH AND HUMAN EXPERIMENTATION. ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION.

Objective of the seminar 6:

To enable the students to understand the ethical problems facing transplantation from living donor and from cadavers and to provide students with a guiding framework for thinking about the ethical dilemmas of human experimentation.

Enabling objectives:

At the end of the seminar the students should be able to:

- 1. Answer the question why experiments and trials on human beings are necessary.
- 2. Enumerate the objectives of human experimentation.
- 3. Determine ethical problems related with involving some particular groups of people in experiments children, pregnant women, nursing mothers, mentally ill, subordinate persons, prisoners.
- 4. Enumerate the main principles of human experimentation according to declaration of Helsinki.
- 5. Discuss general ethical problems of transplantation and special ethical problems of foetal tissue transplantation, living and cadaver donation.

- A. Types of human experimentation therapeutic and non-therapeutic biomedical research.
- B. Necessity of human experimentation and objectives.
- C. Main ethical requirements in human experimentation.
- D. Ethical problems of human experimentation in particular groups of people.
- E. Declaration of Helsinki.
- 2. Ethical questions of tissue and organ transplantation :
 - A. Types of transplantation.
 - B. Ethical questions of living organ and tissue donation.
 - C. Ethical aspects of organ transplantation from cadavers.

- 1. Discussion of case vignettes.
- 2. Discussion of *declarations of Helsinki*.
