SEMINAR 7

MORAL DILEMMAS IN ALLOCATING MEDICAL RESOURCES. PUBLIC HEALTH ETHICS.

Objective of the seminar 7:

To enable the students to understand the ethical problems facing health policy today, to provide them with a broad understanding of the approaches to allocation of the resources in health care and to underline the conflict between justice and the other ethical principles.

Enabling objectives:

At the end of the seminar the students should be able to:

- 1. Determine the ethical dilemmas in allocating medical resources.
- 2. Distinguishing between macroallocation and microallocation.
- 3. Suggest appropriate solutions for particular cases related to distribution of resources in medical practice.
- 4. Decide when the principle of justice has priority over the other principles of medical ethics.
- 5. Discuss the basic principles of public health ethics.

Syllabus of the seminar:

- 1. Right to heath. Conflict between different groups as regards health care. Principle of justice in medicine.
- 2. Theories of resource allocation.
- 3. Rationing health care on the society level. Health policy and ethics:
 - A) Factors that have to be taken into account
 - B)The scope of the health policy
- 3. The common good
- 4. Ethical questions of microallocation
